Andrew Jack Freeman, was born on August 19, 1940, as the twelfth of thirteen children to the late Woodson and Florence Freeman in Chestertown, MD. Andrew transitioned on February 3, 2021, at Seasons Hospice in Christiana, Delaware. He was educated in the Kent County Public School System graduating from Garnett High School in Chestertown, MD.

Andrew was raised in a home where God was paramount. As a young man he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. He attended Mt. Pisgah United Methodist Church in Melitota and later joined Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Chestertown. He was a member of the Bethelites choir and was involved in the men's ministry. Andrew was also a member of Thomas H. Kiah #101 Masonic Lodge.

Andrew held several jobs with Local 199 in Delaware and eventually moved to Wilmington, DE. Andrew was a skilled landscaper and provided lawn care services in Delaware and Maryland. He always ensured that the grass at the Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Cemetery in Fairlee was meticulously manicured.

Andrew was a family man and enjoyed sharing memories. He could tell you who was related to who and how they were related. We would call him the "Historian" because he would make sure you had it straight by the time you left the conversation.

In the last year of his life, Andrew returned home to Chestertown to be cared for by his devoted son, Marcus. He leaves to mourn his passing two sons, Marcus and Charles Freeman, five grandchildren, XXX great grandchildren, two sisters Dorothy Wilson and Florence Briscoe (Herbert), one brother Simon Freeman, and a host of other family members and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents Woodson and Florence Freeman, three sisters: Lillian Freeman, Beatrice Freeman and Ellen Annie Lively and six brothers: Howard Freeman, Norman Freeman, Melvin Freeman, Woodson Freeman, Charles Freeman, and George Freeman.
