



## Mrs. Dyanne Welte

November 21, 1942 - July 5, 2013

Dyanne Welte, beloved wife of Bob Welte, died on Friday, July 5, 2013 at Johns Hopkins Medical Center. She was 70.

Born in New Jersey, she grew up in California where she was employed at Ford Aerospace as a program manager. It was there that she met her future husband, Bob. They were married in 1973 at Stanford University in Palo Alto. She followed her husband as his career moved to the east coast – from Gaithersburg, MD to Greenwich, CT, onto Washington, DC and finally to the Eastern Shore.

The many who knew Dyanne remember an energetic, enthusiastic, and merry lady – always first to volunteer. Dyanne was a founding member of the Talbot Preservation Alliance, a group dedicated to preserving and protecting the rural environment of Talbot County. She was also a committed sponsor of Chesapeake Chamber Music, not only organizing many of the fundraisers in support of CCM, but always hosting visiting musicians in her home. Following her devotion to the performing arts, Dyanne was an Avalon Producers' Guild member for many years. She worked at Lanham Hall because of her love of antiques. Dyanne was never one to miss volunteering at Republican headquarters during elections.

She is survived by her husband of 40 years, Bob; her mother, Alice Walsh, also living in Easton; her five children, Clay, Lynne, Julie, Lori and Carrie; and her three grandchildren, Brian, Allison and Matty.
