Edward Frederick Frase of Easton, died on Saturday, March 14, 2020 at Talbot Hospice House after a lengthy illness.

Edward was born on October 16, 1934 to Anna Bessie Frase and Frederick William Frase. He is survived by his loving wife of 61 years, Mary Ann (Maureen) Frase and their four children; Cynthia Harman (Aaron) of Cambridge, MD, Craig Frase (Carol) of Ellicott City, MD, Kevin Frase (Becca) of Cleveland, TN and Andrew Frase (Tracy) of Trappe, MD, as well as fifteen grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. He was employed by the Landon Willis Hatchery and then Waverly Press for sixteen years, then took a job with the Government Printing Office in Washington, D.C. for 29 years until his retirement.
