February 23, 1925 - March 11, 2021

Joseph Brent “Mike” Runnels of Easton passed away on March 11, 2021. He was 96 years old.

Born February 23, 1925 in Baltimore, MD, he was the son of the late Joseph Clifton and Louise Miles Runnels. After high school, he served in the Navy Air Corp in the South Pacific during World War II. Following his release from active duty, at the end of World War II, he attended George Washington University in Washington, DC for two years. He then joined the family business, Commercial Office Furniture Company in Washington, DC. In November of 1978, he married the former Norma Constance “Penny” Campbell, and they made their home in Montgomery Village. Mr. Runnels retired after 35 years with the company and in July 2000, they moved to Easton Club.

Mr. Runnels is survived by his wife Norma Campbell; daughters, Susan G. Wilton (Ralph) of Missouri City, TX and Robin A. Dick (Douglas) of Rotonda West, FL and son, Joseph B.
