Kit M. Bradley, Sr. passed away on January 20, 2021 at Talbot Hospice House in Easton. He was 82 years old.

He was born on January 14, 1939 in Cambridge, MD, the son of the late Allen M. Bradley and Gladys Booze Bradley.

Kit was raised in Easton, enjoying boating, hunting and later in life, crabbing and fishing. Kit worked for his father at Bradley's Hatchery during his school years. He graduated from Easton High School in 1958 and attended the University of Maryland. In 1960, he married his high school sweetheart, Marie Lane of Easton. They were married almost 61 years and have two sons, Kit Bradley, Jr., Lance Bradley, RN and their unofficially adopted son, Greg Callahan, who was always by his side. Kit taught Greg to fish, crab and to enjoy being on the "Lady Marie", his boat.

Kit was also employed by the State of Maryland as assistant state supervisor of dairy and poultry products for a number of years before moving to Virginia, where he worked in the seafood industry. He served in the National Guard for three years. Kit enjoyed his traveling to South America and China while working as a seafood broker. In 1986 he and Marie moved back to the Eastern Shore where he resided until his death.

Kit is survived by his wife, Marie Bradley; two sons, Kit Bradley, Jr. (Ruth), of Harmony, Lance Bradley, RN (Lisa) and Greg Callahan, two grandsons; Sterling Lane Bradley and Ethan Lindy Bradley, step-grandson, Eric Dragone, brother-in-law, George Harrison, sister-in-law, Carole Chandler Lane and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Allen and Gladys Bradley, his sister, Kay Harrison and brother-in-law, Laurence Lane.

He loved his pickup truck and his boat, "Lady Marie".
