M. Roland Luers, 88, died on January 2, 2019 at the University of MD Shore Medical Center at Easton.

Mr. Luers was born on January 12, 1930 in Ellicott City, MD, the son of the late Peter B. Luers and Mary E. Sehlhorst Luers.

Roland attended All Saints Catholic School, until beginning work. In 1951, he entered into the U.S. Marines and was honorably discharged in 1953. He worked for Schmidt Baking Company as a salesman from 1957 to 1989. On May 11, 1973, he married Dorothy C. Klimczak and resided in Catonsville, until they retired to Easton, MD in 1992.

Roland was a member of the American Legion Post #79 and enjoyed traveling, woodworking and bowling. He was a devoted member of Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Easton, Maryland.

He is survived by his two daughters, Sharon Jaworski and Janet Burton; three stepchildren, Kenneth W. Smith, Mark C. Smith and Sallyanne Smith; nine grandchildren; Adam Smith, Laura Smith, Christopher Smith, Emily Smith, Justin Jaworski, Renee Jaworski, William "Billy" Gibson, Kirsten Smith and Graham Smith; two great-grandchildren; Milo Smith and William Boyd Gibson.

Roland was preceded in death by his wife Dorothy C. Luers in 2013 and his brother Joseph B. Luers in 2011.
