Pamela Sue Richardson Purrington was born to Ross and Thelma Richardson, of Lyndonville, Vermont, on October 12, 1944. Surrounded by loving family, she experiences her glorious entrance into heaven on November 27, 2019. She is survived by her husband, David R. Purrington, whom she married on July 3, 1965, two sons, Brian Ross and his wife Kara, Derek Scott and his wife Kristan, twelve grandchildren, and two brothers, Jeff Richardson and Greg Richardson.

Pam gave her life to Jesus Christ as her personal Lord and Savior, in the fall of 1977. As a result of her testimony and life, Dave and her two boys also came to trust the Lord as their Savior. Their faith opened up a new life of opportunities to serve the Lord in local church and world-wide ministries. Together, Dave and Pam were called to serve for five years at Cedarville College, Cedarville, Ohio; two years at Sciota Hills Baptist Camp, Wheelersburg, Ohio; and 15 years at the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism, New Cumberland, PA. Mission opportunities to serve in building projects included two trips to Japan for two months each; several trips to Portugal totaling 8 months, and a trip to the Czech Republic for two weeks, which also included son Derek.

Her steadfast faith and fierce love for the Lord will continue to serve as an example for those who were touched by her in this life we rest on the promise that we will meet again in the mansions that have been prepared for us on high.

A memorial service will be held on Friday, December 13, 2019 at 11 am at Mariner's Church, 1592 Whitehall Road, Annapolis, MD 21409.
