Robert Joseph Brinkmann, age 70, of Easton, Maryland passed away unexpectedly on February 12, 2021.

Born on December 25, 1950, in Cincinnati, Ohio, he was the son of the late Robert H. Brinkmann and Helen S. Brinkmann. Robert graduated from the University of Notre Dame with a BA, in American Studies, in 1972, from Brown University with an AM, in American Studies, in 1977 and Loyola Law School, Loyola Marymount University, JD, in 1980.

On July 19, 2008, Robert married the love of his life, Lisa, at the Comus Inn in Dickerson, Maryland. Before moving to Easton in 2020, Robert and Lisa lived in Bethesda, Maryland for 10 years. He was an active lobbyist and lawyer.
