Shirley Ann Stone Heintzelman, 84, of Grasonville, MD passed away peacefully in her sleep on Monday, July 15, 2019. Born on February 12, 1935 in Norfolk, VA, she was the daughter of the late Charles E. and Grace Alley Dunbar.

Shirley went to secretarial school and was a secretary in Norfolk, VA. Following moves to Towson, MD and Upper Marlboro, MD she became a substitute teacher until she began her career with Mary Kay Cosmetics in 1972. As her enthusiasm inspired others she ultimately rose to Senior Executive Sales Director. There is no way to adequately describe the impact of Mary Kay philosophies and, through Shirley, how many lives were touched.
