



## Adelaide Truitt

August 15, 1911 - September 11, 2011

Anna Adelaide Truitt of Centreville, MD died at the Corsica Hills Nursing Home, Centreville on Sunday, September 11, 2011. She was 100.

Born August 15, 1911 in the Rectory of St. Peter's Catholic Church in Queenstown, MD, she was the daughter of the late, Howard and Mary Slaughter Shortall. She grew up in Centreville and attended Greenville School near Starr. In 1930 she married James F. Truitt on Dever Farm outside of Ruthsburg, where she worked with her husband. Upon retirement, she moved into Centreville in 1961 and she and her husband worked for Barcus Meat Market. Later she worked for Murdoch Florist. Following her retirement from there she took up craft work, especially quilt making.

She was past president of Ruthsburg Community Hall and Ruthsburg Homemakers. She was also a member of the Altar Rosary Society at Mother of Sorrows Catholic Church, where she was very active and served on many committees.

Mrs. Truitt is survived by three grandchildren, Paul A. DeJuliis, David M. DeJuliis and Theresa Davis; her loving niece, Mary Ruth Meredith; and seven great-grandchildren. She was pre-deceased by her husband, James on March 3, 1990; a son, James F. Truitt, Jr. in 1981 and her daughter, Frances DeJuliis in 2006; four brothers, Edward, Joseph, John and William Shortall and two

sisters, Elva Dwyer and Rosalie Meredith.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at St. Peters Catholic Church, Queenstown, MD on Friday, September 16, 2011 at 12:00 PM where family and friends may call one hour prior to the service from 11:00 – 12:00..
