Albert Brenner, beloved father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, of Easton, MD, formerly of Oxford, MD died on Monday, October 17, 2005 at Talbot Hospice House, Easton. He was 94.

Born February 11, 1911 in New York City, he was the son of the late Samuel and Fannie Hitzik Brenner. After attending public school, he began a career with the Star Overall Company in New York that later became Work Wear. He began his career as a truck driver and remained with the company until retiring in 1975 as Vice President. After retirement, he began a second career from his farm in Walkkill, New York where he raised and raced Standardbred horses. After moving to Oxford, MD in 1989, he continued to race Standardbred horses for a few years.

As a young man he was a winner of the 1929 Golden Gloves boxing award for welterweights in New York State.

His beloved wife of 71 years, the former Anne S. Molloy, whom he married in 1934, died June 21, 2005.

Mr. Brenner was respected by all who knew him. He was caring, kind, and had a positive outlook on life. He was a great role model for his family and will be greatly missed.

He is survived by his daughter, Wendy Bishop and her husband Edward, Jr. of Oxford, MD; four grandchildren, Vicki Darnell and her husband Rick of Orange, CA, Edward Bishop III and his wife Edith of Easton, MD; Gerald Brenner and Dr. Alan Bishop and his wife Georgiana all of Oxford; and three great-grandchildren, Benjamin Brenner, Kendall Bishop and Samuel Bishop. He was predeceased by a son, U.S. Army Warrant Officer 4, Donald Robert Brenner who died in 1988; a grandson, Donald Robert Brenner, Jr.; a sister, Annie Brenner Schultz; and a brother, Hymie Brenner.
