



Alexander C. Dick Jr.

July 24, 1941 - March 29, 2024

Alexander Colclough Dick, Jr. of Chestertown Maryland died on March 29, 2024. He was 82 years of age.

He was born in Wilmington, Delaware on July 24, 1941, the son of the late Dr. Alexander Dick, Sr., and Dorothy Quarles Dick and grew up in Chestertown, MD. He was educated at Phillips Exeter Academy, Class of 1959 and received a Bachelor of Arts in History from Washington College, Class of 1964. He was also on the Men's Varsity Lacrosse Team at Washington College. After graduating, Alec joined the Peace Corps, and was stationed in the Philippines, where he met the love of his life, Margaret Sue Dick. Alec and Sue married on July 21, 1967, in Manila. After completing their years of service, the couple returned home and settled in Baltimore, where Mr. Dick taught mathematics at the Garrison Forest School. Additionally, Mr. Dick received a Master's in Mathematics and Education from the University of Maryland. In 1972, they moved to Syosset, New York on Long Island, where they lived and raised their family. Mr. Dick taught High School Mathematics at Friends Academy of Locust Valley, NY. He loved his students and devoted his career to teaching them both in the classroom and on the field. Mr. Dick was an athlete his entire life from lacrosse, to running, skiing, tennis and cycling. Cycling became his athletic passion for decades. He was a member of the Huntington Bike Club where he clocked thousands of miles, volunteered for countless events and toured various parts of the country with his biking friends. Additionally, he was a member of Trinity Episcopal Church of Roslyn, NY. After retirement, he

returned to Chestertown with his wife where he continued to bike, joined Emmanuel Episcopal Church and generally enjoyed small town life with new and old friends of all ages and walks of life.

In addition to his wife, Sue, he is survived by his daughter: Emily Q. Bose of Baltimore, Maryland and his son: David C. Dick of San Francisco, California, his twin brother: Macdonald Dick of Ann Arbor, Michigan, his sister: Nancy Dick of Chestertown, Maryland along with his beloved grandsons: Xandy, Coco, Mac, Finn, and Patrick.

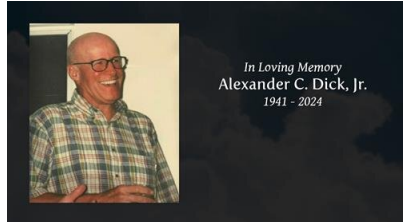

“ To Alec's entire family:

I'm a 1982 graduate of F.A. who had the great grace to know Alec as a math student & lacrosse coach. His passion for teaching & people was evident from my first interaction with him. He mixed these ingredients with humor to form a perfect potion that made you feel like you CAN do that math problem or CAN make that pass from behind the opponents goal to a cutting midfielder. In fact I can hear him right now -- as if it was yesterday and not 40+ years ago -- step-by-step & out loud in front of the whole class walking me through a math problem, then suddenly concluding with exuberance in his slight southern drawl: "Alright... so WRAP-IT-UP!!" It was this positivity & optimism he exuded that I probably didn't fully see or appreciate until later in adulthood.

And unlike most adults it seemed to me at the time, he was who he was, leaving it all out there for everyone to see -- no act, no ulterior motive, no facade. That rare quality of being the genuine "real deal" made him uncommon (in the best of definitions), and respected by & approachable to all.

Alec also knew my mother (Doris) well, as she too was a dedicated teacher at F.A. for a near eternity, though in the pre-K class in the lower school. Over the years she shared with me many of her own memorable & comedic moments with Alec, and how much she too appreciated the person he was.

Alec (Mr. Dick to me always) had a positive impact on me -- which I don't think I ever had the chance to tell him myself. So I want to share that with each of you. There's not much in life that someone can achieve that has greater importance than that.

I have two specific memories of this great teacher. The first is that he ALWAYS referred to me as "Leslie Jan" -- my first and middle name, for a reason I still don't understand, but I came to love it as a term of endearment for a "non-math person." The second is something that happened in Algebra 2, when a classmate asked the question, "Why do we always use "x" as the unknown?" Mr. Dick's response to this was a pop quiz: we were all to take out a piece of paper and write what we thought the answer to that question was. Five minutes later, all papers were passed to him and he quickly looked at each one (most of which I believe were algebraic formulas). When he got to mine, he stopped and put it aside. After going through all the papers, he said, "One person got this right -- Leslie Jan!" (I was not the only one in the class who was shocked by this news.) But it was a great moment for a non-math person who tried very hard. And in case you're curious, my answer to the question "Why do we always use "x" as the unknown?" was: "So everybody does the same thing" (which Mr. Dick repeated slowly and with glee). 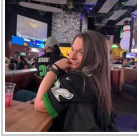

Mr. Dick was my algebra teacher at Friends from 1974 to 1977. And as fundamentally opposed as I was (and always remained) to actually learning Algebra, I regarded him as a friend, a confidant and one of the "good guys" of the faculty - and it was so rare for me to hold a faculty member in such high esteem, primarily because I was so immature at the time . However, that's not why I'm writing - as these are attributes of Mr. Dick which will be repeated by my fellow Alumni many times in this space. I want to share something else. On November 11, 1975 we gathered for our 2 p.m , Tuesday Algebra II class as usual. Mr. Dick came into the room and he sat at his desk. He propped his legs on top of the desk and he stayed silent for about 30 seconds gazing out the window looking out onto the Lower School plaza. Finally, as he continued looking out the window, away from the class, he said quietly, "yesterday, The United Nations General Assembly adopted a Resolution determining that Zionism is a form of racism and racial discrimination". He shook his head in disgust. And then he started class. I wasn't particularly religious (I'm Jewish) but the solemnity of his comment - and coming from my Math teacher - has stayed with me ever since - 50 years later. And that was Mr. Dick. He was a complete human being.
