



## Alfred "Alfie" Lee Evans Jr.

September 16, 1940 - February 6, 2015

It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Alfred Lee Evans Jr., 74, of Centreville, MD, who died peacefully on February 6, 2015, while on a cruise ship in the Caribbean. He leaves behind his beloved wife, Georgiana Coyle; three daughters, Amanda Donefer, Cynthia Chelala, Cassandra Flinn; one son, Nicholas Evans; three step-children, Michael Mundy, Cornelius Patrick Mundy, Molly Coyle Jardiniano; one sister, Judy Simmons, and ten grandchildren.
