February 17, 1920 - April 25, 2017

Alice R. Long, 97, died on April 25, 2017, at Bayleigh Chase in Easton.

Alice R. Long was born Alice Robertson on February 17, 1920, in Washington, DC. She grew up in the farming community of Kenilworth, on the border with Maryland. She attended the University of Maryland in College Park, graduating in 1942 with a Bachelor's Degree in English. While a student there, she met James W. Long, and they were married on February 23, 1943.

While her husband served in Europe with the Army Medical Corps during World War II, Alice worked in Washington, DC, for the British Embassy and then the National Academy of Sciences. Promptly after the conclusion of the war, they had their only child, son, Steven. Alice concentrated on raising their son, while her husband practiced family medicine in Washington and then Bethesda, MD. In the late 1970's, she helped her husband write a book to help non-professionals better understand the intended benefits, common side-effects, potential adverse reactions and interactions of the most frequently prescribed medicines, which was published by Harper Collins as "The Essential Guide to Prescription Drugs".

They moved to the Easton/Oxford area in 1983 where they continued to work together on annual editions of the book until her husband's death in 2000. For many years, Alice also volunteered at Easton Memorial Hospital in the

emergency room reception/intake area.

She is survived by her son, Steven Long.
