



Alice Wagenaar Slot

November 16, 1909 - January 9, 2011

Alice Wagenaar Slot, a longtime resident of Kent Island and a native of The Netherlands, died Sunday January 9, 2010, at the age of 101.

Mrs. Slot and her family immigrated to the United States in 1947 to begin a new life in the country they loved. Alice and Bill became American Citizens in 1955. Alice spent her early years in France and became interested in art and photography at a young age. Bill and Alice endured the occupation of Holland and resisted the enemy by helping others survive. She retired from the Department of Agriculture in 1975 moving back to Queen Anne's County where they felt at home.

Mrs. Slot was a member of the Christian Reformed Church in Washington D.C., and was active in the U.S. Naval Academy Chapel Midshipman support program for a number of years. Alice was an artist accomplished in many forms of art. She was honored in 1994 for her artistic and service contributions by the State of Maryland being chosen as Queen Anne County's representative for the Maryland You Are Beautiful Award.

Mrs. Slot was predeceased by her husband of 66 years William "Bill" Slot in 2002. She is survived by four sons, Peter of Houston, TX, Jacob and Arie of Fort Myers, FL, and Parke of Chester, MD; six grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren.

Services will be held at 6 p.m. on Friday, January 14, at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, Chester, where friends may call from 4 till 6 p.m.

A private burial will be at 10 A.M. at Fort Lincoln Cemetery, Brentwood.
