Allen Carl Prah of Andrews, MD passed away on Thursday, July 16, 2009 at the Dorchester General Hospital in Cambridge. He was 78.

“Fuzzy”, as he was known to family and friends, was born on May 11, 1931 in Denton, MD to the late, George Allen and Margaret Carey Prah. He was educated in Talbot County Public Schools.
