



## Alma E. Milburn

September 23, 1922 - November 23, 2008

Alma E. Milburn of Easton, MD died on Sunday, November 23, 2008 at Genesis Health Care – The Pines, Easton. She was 86.

Born September 23, 1922 in Mineral County, West Virginia, she was the youngest daughter of the late Orus and Leota Leatherman Miller.
