Amy Louise Schlenker of Gaithersburg, MD, died Tuesday, February 15, 2011. She was 50. She was born on February 20, 1960 in New Jersey to Marvin Frederick Schlenker of Chestertown, MD, and the late LaRue Laura Kistler Schlenker.

Amy graduated from Northern Valley Regional High School in Old Tappan, NJ, with the Class of 1978, where she played the oboe with the High School Band and Orchestras. Following high school, she attended Drexel University, studying fashion design and merchandising earning a Bachelor of Science degree and graduating with honors in 1982.

Ms. Schlenker worked as a department manager for a large retail chain, a customer service representative with DOW Chemical Company in Mt. Laurel, NJ, and a program manager at Macro International. She also worked for Hughes Network Systems as a knowledge base administrator. Amy was a certified personal trainer, a creative designer, and an avid reader.

In addition to her father, she is survived by her sister: Sally Schlenker Pfabe of Stevensville, MD, and her niece, Charlotte Pfabe of Stevensville, MD.

The family will be holding a private memorial service.

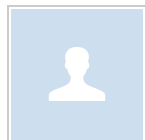
