"When a painting goes well for me, I experience a quiet "ecstasy." His artwork has been widely exhibited and recently in a gallery in Rehoboth Beach, DE.

Andy was an authentic and genuine person, who loved and enjoyed the simplicity of life on the Eastern Shore – his loving family and friends, the freedom of openness, the multi colors of nature, open vistas of farmland, and the tranquility and simplicity of the water. All were inspirational aspects of his life.

Andy leaves behind his devoted and loving wife, Dana, of 19 years; his sisters, Linda Keyes, Kathy Miller; nephew, Russell Lily; two stepsons, Robert Beatty III; William Beatty; and his four cats, Hastings; Miss Teenie, Ray, and Disco.

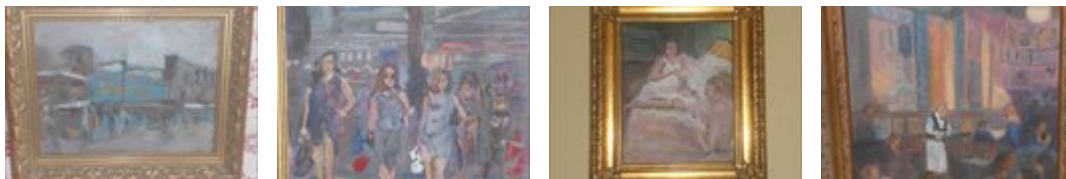
