



Ann Sue Squire

July 7, 1940 - August 4, 2025

Ann “Annie” Sue Squire passed away at home surrounded by her loving family on August 4, 2025. She was 85. Born Anna Asunta Attiani on July 7, 1940, in Chester, PA, she was the second child of the late Rose and Alfred Attiani. Ann grew up in Chester and graduated from Notre Dame High School in Moylan, PA, in 1958. Her career as a secretary at Vertol/Boeing brought her to a fateful encounter in 1961: Robert Jerome Squire, Sr., the man who would become her beloved husband of nearly six decades, and he would refer to her as his “beautiful bride” for all of those years. They were wed on September 18, 1965, building a life in Ridley Township, PA until 1979, when they discovered their dream home in Galena, MD. There, they lovingly raised their children, fostering a vibrant household.

Ann's deep faith shone brightly as a devoted parishioner at St. Dennis Catholic Church, Galena MD. She passionately led CCD classes, delighted in the lively church bake sales, and was a driving force behind the St. Joseph's Guild, working tirelessly to secure a bus that transported children to Catholic school at both Immaculate Conception in Elkton and Good Shepherd in Perryville, MD.

Ann was a tireless volunteer and loved working with children. She served as a homeroom mom from 1973 in the Ridley School District in Pennsylvania until 1991 in the Kent County School system in Maryland. She also led a Brownie Troop, focused more on fun and less on earning badges. When her youngest daughter, Kate, attended Immaculate Conception School, Ann dedicated

hours to helping middle schoolers and later, volunteered at Padua Academy. Without a doubt, Ann was the loudest, most enthusiastic cheering section at all her children's events—her boundless energy truly unforgettable.

Ann was the epitome of a “people person” and her favorite people, unquestionably, were children. Ann worked as a cafeteria aide at Kent County High School from 2010 to 2015, while her grandchildren, Savannah and Austin, were students. She loved talking to the children as they came through the cafeteria and they loved her right back, many of them referring to her as Mom-Mom, following Nan and Austin's lead. She enjoyed working at the fine jewelry counter at Boscov's Department Store and was in her glory amongst the sparkle and the shoppers. Ann was also a loving caregiver to her dear friend Tooshy.

Ann embraced life with gusto, finding joy in simple pleasures and had a tendency to break into song. She adored her movies, famously cheering for Rocky with thrilled excitement when it was shown at the KCHS auditorium. A true bookworm, she was often found engrossed in a good read and cherished her trips to the Galena Library with her dear friend, Gladys Russum. Ann loved any opportunity to spend time at the beach and she treasured summers at Crystal Beach in Earlvile, MD, and Myrtle Beach. More than anything, she loved being a wife and mom and cherished every moment spent with her family and friends.

Ann's legacy is carried on by her adoring husband, Robert Jerome Squire, Sr.; her devoted children, Rob Squire (Tricia), Roe Squire (Ned), Maribeth Waddington (Steve), Tim Squire (Denver), and Kate Winward (Mike); her sister-in-law, Ginny Schukraft; and a flourishing family tree of 14 grandchildren, Alyssa, Marissa, Brandon, Savannah, Austin, Brownie, Mickey, Joshua, Annie, Emma, Cooper, Caleb, Izzie, and Dylan, and 4 great-grandchildren, Logan, Sophia, Mazzy, and Essex. She is also survived by her very special German Shorthaired Pointer, Gus, who brought her immense comfort and companionship.

In addition to her parents, Ann is preceded in death by her beloved son,

Michael and daughter, Annie who was born into eternal rest in 1979; her brother, John Attiani; and her cherished aunt and uncle, Connie and Jim Porreca.

The family would like to extend their gratitude to Compass Hospice for their compassionate care of Ann in her final weeks and to Ann Carpenter, who not only cared for Ann but loved her and gave of her time selflessly.

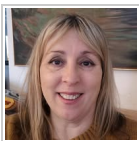
