September 26, 1925 - August 27, 2011

Anne Bell of Queenstown, MD died at her home on Saturday, August 27, 2011. She was 85.

Born September 26, 1925 in Philadelphia, PA, she was the daughter of the late Charles Townsend and Constance Cameron Ludington.

She graduated from Shipley High School in Philadelphia, PA and later received her BA from Bryn Mawr College in Philadelphia, PA. In April 1948 she married Samuel Bell, Jr. of Philadelphia, PA. Mrs. Bell raised her family in Miami, FL and later she and her husband lived on their sailboat. They sailed to Europe and when they returned they settled in Queenstown, MD. Mr. Bell died November 25, 2009.

She did volunteer work at the Academy of the Arts in Easton, MD.

Mrs. Bell is survived by three sons, Nicholas Bell and Samuel Bell, III, both of New York, NY and Charles Bell of Washington, DC; a daughter, Tiffany Bell and her husband, Richard Gluckman of New York, NY; a sister, Constance Drayton of Philadelphia, PA; a brother, Townsend Ludington of Chapel Hill, NC and two granddaughters, Nell Gluckman and Marina Gluckman. In addition to her parents and husband, she was pre-deceased by a sister, Ethel Anderson.
