Anne Jeffrey Robinett of Centreville, MD, passed away on July 27, 2016, at Compass Regional Hospice Center in Centreville, MD. She was 65.

Born on December 30, 1950, in Keyser, WV, the daughter of the late Blair J. Robinett and Deloris Jean Leighton Robinett. She grew up in a military family and would end up in Centreville in 1960. Anne earned her BS and Master's degree in Elementary Education from Salisbury University. She taught for 30 years at Sudlersville Middle School and Elementary and then for 14 years at Kennard Elementary School.

Anne loved to read, collect stamps, do needlework and volunteer at Corsica Hills Nursing Home, where she assisted with fellowship to those that needed it. Her entire life was spent teaching "her children."

Anne is survived by her sisters, Robbie Robinett of Centreville, MD and Melody R. Wilkins of Princess Anne, MD; niece, Erin, and her husband Eric; and great-nephew Owen.

Services will be held on Saturday, August 13, 2016, at 2 pm at the Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. in Centreville, MD.

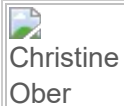

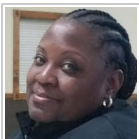

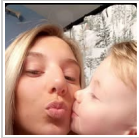
