



## Arlene E. Baybutt

October 14, 1921 - July 12, 2008

Arlene E. Baybutt of Easton, MD died on Saturday, July 12, 2008 at the University of Maryland Medical Center, Baltimore, MD. She was 86 years of age.

Born in Utica, NY, on October 14, 1921, she was the daughter of the late Carleton Hugh and Mildred Langdon Evans. After graduating from Clinton Central High School in 1939, she attended Syracuse University Hospital School of Nursing, graduating in 1943. She then worked as a private duty nurse in the Rochester area. In December of 1943, she married Dr. John Edward Baybutt. Following his release from active duty, they lived in Baltimore until moving to Easton in 1948, where she served as a clinical instructor at the Memorial Hospital School of Nursing until 1951. She then worked part time as an office nurse. Following her husband's death in 1977, she returned to nursing at the Eastern Shore Hospital Center, Cambridge, retiring in 1983. She then worked for the U.S. Dept. of Transportation from 1983 to 1988. She also helped to organize Home Call, a nursing service in Talbot County in the early 1980's.

Active in the community, she was a member of Christ Church, Easton, where she served on the Altar Guild. In recent years she had been actively involved in Bible studies and worship services at the Shore Harvest Presbyterian Church of Easton. Mrs. Baybutt was past president of the Talbot County TB

Association, was a member of the National TB Association Board of Directors, and chaired a national TB convention in New York City. She helped organize the Upper Shore Heart Association and was a past member of the Maryland Heart Association Board of Directors. She also helped to organize and was past president of the Upper Shore Association for Retarded Children. Mrs. Baybutt was active in Childrens Aid and the Talbot County Mental Health Association. She helped organize the Four County Medical Society Auxiliary, of which she was a past president and served on the Board of the State Auxiliary. As an active member of the Republican Party, she worked in many campaigns and served on the Republican State Central Committee.

Mrs. Baybutt is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Betsy B. Jallade and Mrs. Lori B. Hutchison, both of Easton; two sons, Mr. John E. Baybutt, Jr. of Lincoln, DE, and Dr. Richard C. Baybutt, of North Aurora, IL; one sister, Mrs. Loreene DeSilva of Cazenovia, NY, and 13 grandchildren.
