Arlin Wayne Carter of Centreville, MD died on Tuesday, August 4, 2009 at Easton Memorial Hospital, Easton, MD. He was 61.

Born July 22, 1948 in Baltimore, MD, he was the son of the late, Joseph Wayne and Vivian Ethel Clevenger Carter. He was a patriot, Vietnam Veteran and "Proud son of the Eastern Shore". He graduated from City College High School, Baltimore, MD, Class of 1966. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy during the Vietnam War and received an honorable discharge.

He started his family, moved to the Eastern Shore and worked in the insurance industry for over 30 years. He was an avid decoy collector and spoiler of his grandchildren.

“ Dear Dottie, and Family.

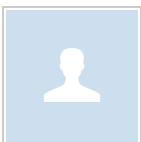
