Arnold Ernest Wolf of Queenstown, MD died Friday March 11, 2011 at the Chestertown Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Chestertown, MD. He was 80.

Born on January 10, 1930 in Baltimore MD. Arnold grew up in Baltimore and would enlist and serve in the Marine Corps during the Korean War. After he was honorably discharged he worked for the US Navy in Annapolis, MD as a foreman in the ship yard. Upon his retirement he moved to the eastern shore of Maryland.
