



## Arthur L.S. Waxter

June 25, 1926 - December 2, 2013

Arthur Lee Shreve Waxter died on Monday, December 2, 2013, at Talbot Hospice in Easton, MD. He was 87.

Arthur L. S. Waxter was born on June 25, 1926, in Baltimore, MD, the son of William Deal Waxter, Jr., and Sallie Dorsey Shreve Waxter.

He attended University of Dubuque-U.S. Navy freshman year, Northwestern University-U.S. Navy sophomore year and Yale University for his junior and senior year. He graduated in 1948. He served in the U.S. Navy from June 1944 to June 1946 and January 1952 to November 1953. He was the Operations Officer on the USS Blackwood DE-219. He served as Lieutenant in the U.S. Naval Reserves.

On December 3, 1949, he married Nancy Daniels in Dayton, OH. He and Nancy lived in Baltimore until 1972, at which time they moved to Easton. He was a member of Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Baltimore and the All Faith Chapel in Tunis Mills, MD. He was also a life member of The Maryland Club.

Mr. Waxter is survived by his wife, Nancy Daniels Waxter; a son, Arthur Lee Shreve Waxter, Jr.; and a daughter, Dorsey Ayers Waxter. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by a brother, William Deal Waxter, III.

A memorial service will be held on Friday, December 6, 2013, at 11:30 a.m. at Emmanuel Episcopal Church, 811 Cathedral St. in Baltimore. A second memorial service will be held on Saturday, December 7, 2013, at 11:30 a.m. at All Faith Chapel, 26281 Tunis Mills Rd., Tunis Mills, MD. Burial will be private.
