



Arthur A. Lemise

July 27, 1926 - May 1, 2009

Arthur A. Lemise of Easton died on May 1, 2009 at Talbot Hospice House, after a long battle with cancer. He was 82.

Born in Jersey City, NJ on July 27, 1926, he was the son of Arthur and Sarah Miller Lemise. Mr. Lemise lived in North Arlington and in Lyndhurst, NJ for many years before moving to Easton, MD in 1990.

He was a Navy Seabee in World War II serving in the Philippines and the Caroline Islands and in Africa during the Korean conflict. Mr. Lemise was a Lyndhurst Volunteer Fireman for 25 years serving as chief in 1979-80. He was a member of the Lyndhurst American Legion Post #139. He spent his working years as a draftsman at the Kearny, NJ Shipyard before becoming an Ironworker in The International Association of Bridge, Structural and Ornamental Ironworkers. He was a member of the Ironworkers Local #483 in Hackensack, NJ for 42 years.

Mr. Lemise married the former, Joan Martin of New York, NY on November 12, 1949. They were married for 60 years.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his four children, Barbara Esteve of Kempton, PA, Janice Cheney of Baltimore, MD, Arthur Lemise of North Arlington, NJ and Gerard Lemise of East Stroudsburg, PA; six grandchildren

and one great granddaughter.

He was preceded in death by a sister, Agnes O'Malley and a brother, Peter Lemise.

Services will be private at the Maryland Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery in Hurlock, MD.
