



Atwood Sinclair Barwick

April 12, 1934 - February 18, 2012

Atwood Sinclair Barwick of Chestertown, MD, died on February 18, 2012, at The University of Maryland Medical Center in Baltimore, MD. He was 77.

He was born in Silver Spring, Maryland on April 12, 1934, the son of the late, Arthur Richardson and Leah Cecilia Catlin Barwick. Mr. Barwick graduated from Montgomery Blair High School, Class of 1952 and George Washington University, Class of 1960 with a degree in Geology. He served in the Pacific with the U.S. Coast Guard Reserves and was honorably discharged.

He worked with the Department of the Navy as an Oceanographer for 20 years. He then worked with the Office of the Secretary of Defense for 3 1/2 years before retiring in 1980.

Mr. Barwick lived in Annapolis and later Somerset County where he pursued his interest in Archeology and family history. He lived in Connecticut for a few years and later settled in Chestertown, MD. He enjoyed Archeology, restoring old and historic homes, and family history.

He is survived by his sister, Virginia Barwick Dildine and her husband, John of Falls Village, CT; two nieces, Deborah Barwick of NJ and Constance Walsh of NY; a nephew, Wesley Dildine of CA; and a stepbrother, Earl Collier Pate of NE.

Funeral services will be held on Sunday, February 26, 2012, at 1 p.m. at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, 7760 Sandy Bottom Road, Chestertown, MD.
