



## Audrey Leah Veasel

March 6, 1926 - January 2, 2009

Audrey Leah Veasel of Stevensville, MD, died Friday January 2, 2009, at Baltimore Washington Medical Center. She was 82.

Audrey was born on March 6, 1926, in Baltimore, MD, the daughter of the late Charles F. Kirner and Olga L. Neumann. She attended Quinns Falls Junior High and Western High School. After school she began working for Woolworth Company and would later work with Rentex Corporation until 1969. In 1969, she and her husband established a ceramics company called "That Ceramic Shop" in Lansdowne, MD, on Hammonds Ferry Road and retiring in 1984. She was a member of the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary.

She is survived by two daughters, Diane Burton of Lansdowne, MD, and Barbara Hyatt of Glen Burnie, MD; four grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren; and two great-great-grandchildren.
