



Aurelia Margerete Meierhoff Van Derveer

April 25, 1919 - November 9, 2013

Aurelia Margerete Meierhoff Van Derveer died on Saturday, November 9, 2013, at William Hill Manor in Easton, MD. She was 94.

Born April 25, 1919, in Steelville, IL, she was the daughter of the late Fritz W. and Lydia Meierhoff. She attended school in Steelville and Chester High School in Chester, IL graduating Class of 1937. She then attended Brown Business College in Centralia, IL, Class of 1938. During her working years, she worked for The United States Government at The Pentagon.

She was a member of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Preston, MD, and also a member of the ladies Aide of the church.

Her husband John G. Van Derveer whom she married June 16, 1943, in Washington DC, died in 1976.

She is survived by her daughter, Donna Ruth VanDerveer, and a son, Douglas DuBois VanDerveer and his wife Theresa Anne VanDerveer; a sister, Ruth Hampton; and three grandchildren, Thera, LeAnne, and David.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was also predeceased by a son, Donald "Donnie" VanDerveer and a brother, Harold "Butch" Meierhoff.
