



Barbara E. Marsh

December 30, 1933 - September 30, 2011

Barbara Elizabeth Marsh died peacefully at Hospice of Queen Anne's County this past Friday, September 30th, the same day as her late husband Robert Marsh four years earlier, after a long battle with Cancer. She was 77 years old.

Born in New York City on December 30th 1933, she was the daughter of Robert W. O'Hara and Ricci Gano. She spent most of her childhood years growing up in Wethersfield, Connecticut. A graduate of the University of Vermont, Barb was a proud member of the Kappa Alpha Theta sorority. After college, Barb moved to NYC where she worked as an editor for multiple publishing companies before marrying Robert "Bob" Marsh in 1959. Barb and Bob initially moved to Sharon, Massachusetts before moving to Red Bank, New Jersey where they lived for 35 years. While living in New Jersey, Barb worked for the Middletown Board of Education, where she taught as a school teacher for 32 years at Navesink Elementary School, Bayview Elementary School and Thompson Junior High School.

Upon retiring in 1996, Barb and Bob moved to St Michaels, Maryland to be closer to their family. While living in St Michaels Barb spent her free time volunteering for both the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum and the local St Michaels thrift shop.

Barb is survived by her son Robert W. Marsh III and daughter in-law Frances D. Marsh as well as her grandchildren Robert W. Marsh IV and John F. Marsh, all of Queen Anne's County, Maryland.
