Barbara Moore Messick of Easton, MD died on Thursday, January 29, 2009 at Memorial Hospital at Easton. She was 86.

Born September 30, 1922 in Ellet, VA, she was the daughter of the late James F. and Sally Booth Beacham. After graduating from Vineland High School in Vineland, NJ, she attended nursing school at Easton Memorial Hospital where she earned her nursing degree. She then began a lifelong career, first working as head operating room nurse at Easton Memorial Hospital and then in several doctors' offices.

Her husband, Leroy W. Messick, whom she married February 19, 1943, died March 26, 2008.

Mrs. Messick was a charter member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church, Easton and a member of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Talbot Rod and Gun Club.
