



Benedict "Ben" A. Caccia

Benedict "Ben" A. Caccia of Easton, MD, formerly of Hastings on Hudson, NY, died on Tuesday, January 30, 2007 at Genesis Healthcare-The Pines. He was 76.

Born October 18, 1930 in Bronx, NY, he was the son of Vincent and Mary Victoria Salerno Caccia. After graduating from Dewitt Clinton High School, Bronx, NY in 1946, he attended Fordham College where he earned his BS degree in 1949. From 1949 - 1950 he attended St. John's University Law School, and then from 1950 to 1951 worked as a caseworker for the New York City Department of Welfare. In 1951 to 1955 he served in the U.S. Navy. In 1957 he entered New York University, earning his MBA in 1959. He then took a position with International Business Machines Corporation (IBM) in 1960 where he worked in Administrative Management and as Manager of Litigation Support Services. From 1978 – 1988 he served as Manager of International Assignments for IBM World Trade Organization.

Mr. Caccia was a Hastings on Hudson Village Trustee from 1974 – 1978, serving under Mayors Sheldon Wagner and Julius Chemka, and a member of the Hastings on Hudson Kiwanis Club. Since moving to Easton, MD in 1994, he has been a member of Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church; the Easton Lions Club where he served as Treasurer, Newsletter Editor and organizer of the Annual Community Service Awards Night; a Meals on Wheels volunteer

driver; the Treasurer of Pets on Wheels Delmarva; and a member of Easton B.P.O. Elks Lodge #1622. In 1996 Ben was instrumental in the Founding of The Center for Cardio-Pulmonary Fitness and Wellness at Memorial Hospital at Easton and was honored at its 10th Anniversary in September 2006. Ben was famous for his delicious homemade Christmas cookies, baking as many as 2000 and giving away most of them to his family and friends.

Mr. Caccia is survived by his wife, the former Natalie Stolfi, whom he married October 10, 1954; two children, Edward Caccia and his wife Nancy of Ardsley, NY, and Joanne Dial and her husband Bob of Glenville, NY; four grandchildren, Stacie Huck, John "Jay" Delango, and Emily and Molly Caccia; and three great-grandchildren, Jacqueline and Julia Huck, and Gianni Delango. He was predeceased by a daughter, Mary Elizabeth Delango who died in 2003, and a sister, Josephine Prete who died in 2001.

A Funeral Liturgy will be celebrated on Tuesday, February 6, 2007 at 10:00 AM at Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church, Easton, MD. Friends may call on Monday evening from 7 to 9 PM at Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., Easton, MD.

Private burial will be at the Maryland Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery, Hurlock, MD, at a later date.
