September 11, 1935 - March 27, 2014

Betty Ann Ewing of Easton, MD, passed away on Thursday, March 27, 2014, surrounded by her loving family, at University of Maryland Shore Medical Center at Easton. She was 78.

Born on September 11, 1935, in Easton, MD, to the late Carl J. Worm and Mary F. Marine Worm, she graduated from Preston High School. Mrs. Ewing began working for Preston Trucking Company and was there for 12 years. She then married John M. Ewing, Sr., on February 1, 1963, in Ridgely, MD. She became a homemaker, where she raised her children on the family farm. Mrs. Ewing enjoyed gardening and traveling with “the women.” Above all, she adored her grandchildren.

Mrs. Ewing is survived by her two children, John M. Ewing, Jr. (Shelly) of Preston and Linda E. Booze (Dyke) of Oxford; three siblings, Margie M. Jester, Lloyd O. Worm and Doris M. Worm; and her seven grandchildren, Rebecca, Anna, Emma, Katelyn, Nicholas, Brandon and Christopher. In addition to her husband and parents, she is preceded in death by four siblings, William F. Worm, Carlton L. Worm, Earle B. Worm, and James T. Worm.
