Beulah Johnson Peterson of Easton, MD died on Sunday, August 29, 2004 at Talbot Hospice House, Easton, following a courageous battle with colon cancer. She was 92.

Born January 4, 1912 in Orient, Iowa, she was the youngest of seven children of Frederick and Caroline Truman Johnson. Educated in Iowa, she moved to Madison, Wisconsin, where she was Executive Secretary to the Director of the Forest Products Laboratory, a Federal Government Agency. She married David Winfred Peterson in Madison. They and their two sons moved to Battle Creek, Michigan, and in 1973, Mr. and Mrs. Peterson retired to Naples, Florida. Upon the death of her husband, in May 1999, she moved to William Hill Manor in Easton, to be near her family.

A Master bridge player, she was also an avid reader, and an enthusiastic golfer. She especially enjoyed her long daily walks on the Gulf of Mexico beaches. She was active in various volunteer organizations, notably the American Red Cross, the Republican Party, and her work as a Gray Lady at the Naples Hospital.

Mrs. Peterson is survived by two sons, James K. Peterson and his wife, Nan of Easton, and Timothy D. Peterson, of Traverse City, Michigan; six grandchildren, Dr. Kimberly Peterson Spencer, Kristin Peterson Jaramillo,

David Peterson, Timothy S. Peterson, Matthew Peterson and Gary Peterson; thirteen great-grandchildren, and Hannah, her beloved black lab. She will be greatly missed by all of her family.

A private family service will be held at the Church of The Holy Trinity in Oxford, MD.
