



## Beverly Ann Cregg Halvorsen

February 5, 1943 - August 27, 2010

Beverly Ann (Cregg) Halvorsen, age 67, of Stevensville, MD, died August 27, 2010, in the Anne Arundel Medical Center in Annapolis, MD.
