



## Bonnie L. Lowe

January 22, 1922 - February 13, 2015

Bonnie Lowe of Easton, MD, formerly of Dry Creek, WV, died on Friday, February 13, 2015, at St. Joseph's Nursing Home in Catonsville, MD. She was 93.

Born on January 22, 1922 in Edwight, WV, she was the daughter of the late Hinton and Matilda Pettry. She married the late Thurlo Boggess in 1936. She attended public school and worked as a medical assistant. In 1960, she and her family moved to Maryland. She married the late Andrew Lowe in 1965. She was a waitress for many years and faithfully and joyfully served as a volunteer at The Pines Genesis Eldercare in Easton for 29 years. She was a long-time member of the Easton Church of God.
