Dr. Callum R. W. Bain, 84, of Easton died on Thursday, July 19, 2012 at his home. Born in London, England on January 16, 1928, he was the son of the late, Lawrence Weir-Bain and Doris Marion Thirkell Bain. Dr. Bain has resided in Talbot County since 1967 where he practiced medicine until his retirement in 2007.
