



Calvin Lucas

May 29, 1918 - December 27, 2008

Calvin S. Lucas of Chestertown, MD, died on December 27, 2008, at Chester River Hospital Center in Chestertown, MD. He was 90.

He was born in Wye Mills, MD, on May 29, 1918, the son of the late Bradford and Vallie Chance Lucas. Mr. Lucas attended Church Hill High School and worked on the family's farm in Church Hill. He was drafted into the U.S. Army on May 1, 1943, at Fort Meade and served in the European Theatre and the Middle East Theatre until his honorable discharge on October 16, 1945. He was awarded ribbons of service, good conduct medal, bronze star, and the distinguished unit award as well as a combat medic badge. In 1945, he returned to Church Hill, MD, where he worked with the State of Maryland then Queen Anne's County Roads Department, retiring in 1980.

Mr. Lucas was a life member of Church Hill Volunteer Fire Company where he was past Assistant Chief, a 50+ year member of the V.F.W., a member of the American Legion, and Church Hill United Methodist Church. He enjoyed yard work and was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather

In addition to his wife of 69 years, Frances B. Lucas, he is survived by a son, James C. and his wife, Joanne Lucas of Chestertown; a sister, Ethel Everett of Chestertown; grandchildren, Patricia L. and her husband, John Rudolfs; great grandchildren, Garrett Rudolfs and Mason Rudolfs. A daughter, Nancy

Lucas predeceased him along with brothers, Roland Lucas and Erdman Lucas; and sisters, Reba Lucas and Katherine Lucas.

Funeral services will be held on Tuesday, December 30, 2008, at 1:00 PM, at Fellows, Helfenbein, and Newnam Funeral Home, 130 Speer Road, Chestertown, MD, where relatives and friends may call from 12:00-1:00pm.
