



Calvin Daniel Wilson

July 28, 1931 - March 17, 2015

Calvin Daniel Wilson of Chestertown, MD, died on Tuesday, March 17, 2015, at Chester River Manor. He was 83.

Born on July 28, 1931, in Philadelphia, PA, he was the son of the late Samuel T. and Sylvia Frances Althouse Wilson. Mr. Wilson was a graduate of Northeast High School in Philadelphia, Class of 1949. He attended West Chester State Teachers' College, graduating in 1954 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Education. Mr. Wilson served in the United States Army from 1954 – 1956, and was stationed at Camp Zama Army Hospital in Yokohama, Japan. He married Lois Jean Wilson of Philadelphia on July 28, 1956. He later graduated from West Chester State College in 1972, earning his Master's in Education.

A long time elementary school teacher, Mr. Wilson spent most of his career at Swarthmore Elementary School in Swarthmore, PA, where he was also active as a union representative for the Pennsylvania State Education Association. After retirement, he moved with his wife to Chestertown in 1999.

Mr. Wilson was also a scholar and the author of numerous articles on pedagogy in publications including *Teacher, Learning, and Pennsylvania School Journal*. After his retirement, he co-authored an article with his daughter, an historian, for the journal *Slavery and Abolition*.

Mr. Wilson is survived by a daughter, Carol Wilson, son-in-law Kevin McKillop, and a grandson, Alex Wilson, all of Chestertown, MD. He was predeceased by his wife, Lois in 2004.

A funeral service will be held privately.
