



Calvin James "CJ" Meadows

April 8, 1941 - August 10, 2010

Calvin James Meadows died at his family's home in Stevensville, MD on Tuesday, August 10, 2010. He was 69.

Born on April 8, 1941, he was the son of the late, Asa Rudolph Valentino Meadows and Hazel Lee Ford Meadows. He graduated from Mergenthaler Vocational Technical High School. He joined the U.S. Marines and served in the Vietnam War from 1966 to 1968 and was discharged as a corporal. During his career he worked as a mason in Maryland and Delaware. He was always proud of having worked on many of the brick roads in Annapolis, MD.

He was a member of the VFW in Grasonville, MD and the Eastern Shore Baptist Church in Stevensville, MD. CJ was an avid wrestling fan and enjoyed riding motorcycles with his wife.

CJ is survived by his brother, Billy Eugene Meadows of Cleveland, OH and was preceded in death by his wife of 46 years, Patricia Anita Meadows in 2009.
