



## Carol "Cookie" Smith Crickenberger

March 10, 1942 - September 17, 2024

Carol Smith Crickenberger, affectionally known as "Cookie", 82 of Easton, MD passed away at Talbot Hospice House with family and friends by her side on September 17, 2024.
