May 9, 1937 - July 15, 2009

Carol W. Santelmann of Annapolis, MD, passed away on Wednesday, July 15, 2009, at Anne Arundel Medical Center from complications of Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma. She was 72 years old.

Carol was born May 9, 1937, in Elkins, WV, to the late Doyle W. Andrews and Bessie G. McConkey Andrews. She was raised in Cumberland, MD, and was a graduate of Allegany High School, Class of 1955. She graduated from The Memorial Hospital School of Nursing and began her career as a nurse at Memorial Hospital in Cumberland, MD from 1958 – 1959. She later moved to the Eastern Shore and worked at Easton Memorial Hospital from 1960 - 1964. She worked for the Queen Anne's County Board of Education as a school nurse and then began an enduring career with the Queen Anne's County Health Department as a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner. Her final job was working at the Queen Anne's County Addiction/Kent Island Counseling Center.

She resided in Bay Ridge in Annapolis and was married for 28 years to Edward C. Santelmann. She volunteered at Anne Arundel Medical Center and the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum. Carol enjoyed traveling with Ed, especially to Elderhostels, and gardening. She was a member of the Appalachian Mountain Club and enjoyed walks and hikes, but family always came first.

She is survived by her husband, Edward C. Santelmann of Annapolis, MD; two sons, John Doyle Walker and his wife, LuAnn, of Grasonville, MD, and William Walker of Annapolis, MD; a daughter, Tracy Cohee Hodges and her husband, Douglas, of Wye Mills, MD; a stepdaughter, Diane Gay Santelmann and her husband, Andrew Kontola, of Annapolis, MD; a stepson, Neal Edward Santelmann, and his wife, Carina R. Frantz, of Cold Spring, NY; and three grandchildren, Dashiell Zo Santelmann of Cold Spring, NY, and Kyle and Kristen Walker, both of Grasonville, MD.
