



Carolyn Hope Ferguson Gorsuch

March 5, 1965 - March 5, 2010

Hope Ferguson Gorsuch, a lawyer, a writer, and community volunteer, died suddenly at her home, on March 5, 2010, she was 45 years old.

Hope was the daughter of David H. Ferguson and Patricia Frawley Gates of Chestertown and the wife of Donald Gorsuch of Fairlee. In addition to her parents and husband, she leaves behind two sisters, Heather Oakleaf Ferguson and Holly Ferguson Rhodes; two nieces, Molly M. Rhodes and Katherine C. Rhodes; her stepfather, M. Douglass Gates; a mother-in-law, Grace Gorsuch of Fairlee; and dear friends Betty Burris and Chantelle Thomas. She was predeceased by her stepmother, Hila C. Ferguson, and her loving nanny, Mamie Stewart.

Born in Chestertown on March 5, 1965, Hope was a graduate of Kent School, Inc. and Kent County High School. In 1987, she received a Bachelor's of Science degree from the University of Tampa and later earned a law degree from the University of Baltimore. She was admitted to the Maryland Bar in 1990 and to the District of Columbia Bar in 1998. Hope was a clerk for the Kent County Circuit Court and practiced law in Easton, Ocean City, and Baltimore. Since returning to Chestertown, Hope has been a devoted companion for her sister, Heather, and her beloved black Labrador, Thunder. She enjoyed writing short stories and poetry.

Hope was a passionate animal lover who would have wanted friends to adopt a pet and to make donations in lieu of flowers to the Humane Society of Kent County, where she frequently volunteered. Hope also volunteered at the Chester River Hospital Center.

A memorial funeral service will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 13, at the Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Chestertown.
