October 8, 1916 - April 20, 2013

Catherine Cecelia Curran of Easton, MD, passed away peacefully at the Pines on Saturday, April 20, 2013. She was 96 years old.

Catherine was born in Philadelphia, PA, on October 8, 1916. She was the daughter of the late John F. Rodgers and Anastasia O'Connell Rodgers and the sister of the late Margaret Franey.

Catherine and her late husband, John Patrick Curran, raised their family in Levittown, PA, before retiring to Florida in 1984. She moved to Easton, MD, in 2008.

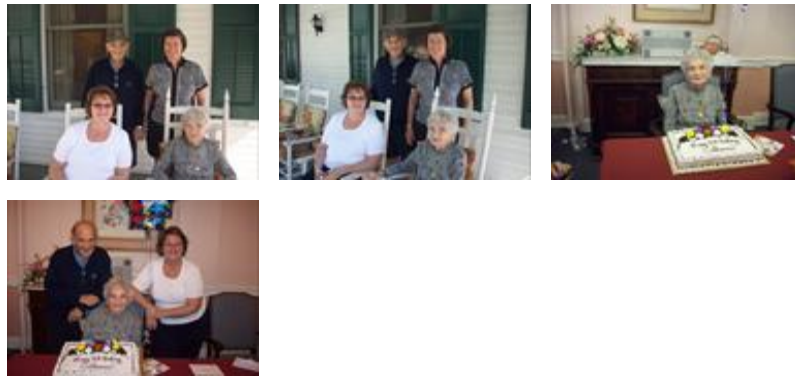
