



## Charles Bagley III

March 22, 2005

Dr. Charles Bagley III of Chestertown, Maryland died on March 22, 2005 at his home. He was 82.

Dr. Bagley was born on May 30, 1922 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late, Charles Jr. and Mary Monroe Harlan Bagley. He graduated from Gilman School in Baltimore in 1939, attended Princeton University from 1939 to 1943 and graduated from Loyola College in Baltimore in 1944. He then served in the United States Marine Corp. After receiving an honorable discharge, he enrolled in the University of Maryland School of Medicine and graduated in 1950. He was the U.S.P.H.S. Fellow in Psychiatry at the University of Maryland School of Medicine from 1953 to 1955 and served as Chief Resident of Psychiatry at the University of Maryland Hospital from 1955 to 1956. From here he entered into private practice from 1959 to 1961, while serving both as an instructor of Psychiatry and Psychiatrist (OPD) at Johns Hopkins Medical School from 1960 to 1961. In 1961 Dr. Bagley moved to Salisbury, Maryland, where he was in private practice until 1992. He also served as a Psychiatrist at Peninsula General Hospital from 1961 to 1988. Dr. Bagley was certified by the American Society of Addictive Medicine in 1987.

He was a member of many professional organizations, including the Maryland Commission on Medical Discipline (1969-1978), Medical and Chirurgical Faculty of Maryland, Wicomico County Medical Society where he served as

President in 1966, Maryland Psychiatric Society, A Life Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, and of the American Society of Addictive Medicine. Dr. Bagley was also an active member of St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Salisbury and served 2 terms as the President of the Resident Council at Heron Point.

In addition to his wife, Margaret Bagley, he is survived by two sons, Charles Bagley IV of Crownsville, MD and John O. Bagley of Gibson Island, MD; one daughter, Mary M. Bagley of Gibson Island, MD; four step daughters, Patricia Lemmerman of North East, MD, Sandra Lemmerman of Durham, ME, Karen Mueller of North East, MD and Deborah Lemmerman of Sudbury, MA; one step son, Douglas Lemmerman of Clemmons, NC; one sister, Elizabeth B. Gerlach of Newton, MA; four grandsons and four granddaughters.

A memorial service will be held on Thursday, March 24, 2005 at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Chestertown, MD at 11 a.m.

Interment will be at St. Paul's Cemetery in Chestertown, MD.
