



## Charles G. Lieck

December 16, 1920 - December 10, 2013

Charles Gilbert Lieck died Tuesday, December 10, 2013, at UMSMC in Easton, MD. He was 92.

Born on December 16, 1920, in Great Neck, NY, he was the son of the late Charles G. Lieck and Johanna Maido Lieck. He graduated from Great Neck High School and worked for two years in the Glass Center at the New York World's Fair.

Mr. Lieck moved to Bridgeport, CT, in 1940, and worked for Vought-Sikorsky Aircraft in Stratford, CT until entering the US Navy during World War II in 1942 as an aviation metal-smith, and serving as an instructor on the staff of the Advanced Base Aviation Training Unit. He served primarily in Norfolk, VA, and St. Charles, MO. At the end of the war, he was assigned to the USS Cape Esperance in the Pacific going to Pearl Harbor and the Philippines on the Magic Carpet program bringing army personnel back to the States.

Mr. Lieck returned to Sikorsky Aircraft in the Engineering Department before leaving for a career as an executive sales representative. He worked for over 30 years for United Gilsonite Laboratories in Scranton, PA covering the MD, VA, and DC areas and retiring in 1987.

Mr. Lieck married Cynthia Crook in September 1951 and lived in McLean and Vienna, VA, where they raised their two daughters, Joanna and Carol, before

moving to Annapolis and residing there for over 30 years. He was an active member of the Vienna Wireless Society and coached both Pigtail and Ponytail softball teams.

Mr. & Mrs. Lieck moved to Easton Club East in 2005. He was a member of the BPOE Elks in Annapolis and Easton. Mr. Lieck loved spending time with his family and also had an interest in amateur radio, boating on the Chesapeake for 40 years, gardening, computers, photography, woodworking and target shooting.

He is survived by his dear wife, Cynthia, and beloved daughters, Joanna Lybarger and Carol Witherow, along with their respective husbands, Patrick and Gary. He also leaves behind his dear grandchildren and their families, Matthew Witherow and wife Jolie, Kate Witherow, and Apryl Nanney and husband Jeffrey, his first great-granddaughter, Romy Jae, and two dear nieces and nephews and their families. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his two sisters, Eleanor Lieck Tietze and Winifred Lieck Hajdu.

A memorial service for Mr. Lieck will be held on Monday, December 16, 2013, at 11 a.m. at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral home, P.A., 200 S. Harrison St., Easton, MD 21601. Interment will be private at the Maryland Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery near Hurlock.
