



## Charles Muntain

January 15, 2004

Charles Thomas "Red" Muntain of Centreville died Thursday, January 15, 2004 at his residence. He was 82.

Born on February 4, 1921 in Baltimore, MD, he was the son of the late Charles C. Goldsborough and Delia Bridgett Brennan. He was raised by his mother and stepfather, Thomas Muntean of Baltimore. He attended Calvert Hall High School. He enlisted in the U.S. Pacific Navy and served on the U.S.S. Overton in the Pacific. On March 8, 1946 he married Lois Mildred Replogle of New Enterprise, PA. They were married 57 years. When he returned to Baltimore, he became a member of the Iron Worker's Local #16. He served as a business agent and then became President of the Building Trades Union. While working, he attended the University of Baltimore where he received his B.S. in Industrial Management. In 1958, he received his Juris Doctor Degree. He would then begin working for the Federal Government in Equal Employment Opportunity Commission in Washington, D.C. Afterwards, he worked for the U.S. Postal Service as a Labor Relations Specialist. Mr. Muntain received a Presidential appointment in HUD-Housing and Urban Development, as Special Assistant to George Romney. In 1977, he entered free enterprise working for Strescon Industries as a Labor Relations Specialist. He retired, but still served, Trustee of Labor International Union Pension Plan in Philadelphia, PA and was on the Commission on Aging for Queen Anne's County.

His volunteer accomplishments involved being Scout Master of Troop #357 in Ferndale, MD, Meals on Wheels for Queen Anne's County and Faithful Navigator of the Knights of Columbus. He was a member of Mother of Sorrows Catholic Church in Centreville, MD.

He is survived by his wife, Lois M. Muntain; four daughters, Miriam and Wayne Retkofsky of Apopka, FL, Rev. Karen and Ben Dize of Queenstown, MD, Mary Beth and Mel Gardner of Centreville, MD and Kathleen and Frank Bahus of Baltimore, MD; one son, Wayne and Jane Muntain of New Enterprise, PA; one sister, Mary Hemelt of Bel Air, MD; eleven grandchildren, David Retkofsky of Bensalem, PA, Lisa Guacci of Apopka, FL, Angela Holocker of Centreville, MD, Michael Gardner of Stevensville, MD, Joshua Muntain of Arlington, VA, Mark Muntain of Rome, Italy, Noah Dize of NYC, Mathew Dize of Queenstown, MD, Juliana Bahus of Birmingham, England, Brenna Bahus of Baltimore, MD and Alexander Bahus of Baltimore, MD; six great grandchildren, Zachary Holocker & Kelley Holocker of Centreville, MD, Brittany Retkofsky of West Chester, PA, Cody Hunter of Bensalem, PA, Laura Guacci & Cara Guacci of Apopka, FL.
