Charles Jacob Weller of Sudlersville, MD, passed away on Tuesday, December 11, 2012, at University of Maryland Medical Center in Baltimore, MD. He was 72.

Born on June 7, 1940, in Sudlersville, MD, he was the son of the late Silas Lungo and Elsie May “Brensfield” Weller. In 1959, he married Norma Wintertein, with whom he had three children.

He began his career working for U.L. Harmen’s in Marydel, MD. Later he went to work for Kraft General Foods in Dover, DE, where he worked for 33 years. He later worked as a driver for the Queen Anne’s Department of Aging for 13 years. Charlie was a member of Calvary Asbury United Methodist Church in Sudlersville, MD, and served many years in the Sudlersville Volunteer Fire Company. In his spare time, Charlie enjoyed gardening, walking, and spending time with his children and grandchildren.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one son, Robert Timothy Weller, in 1989.

He is survived by his wife of 53 years, Norma Weller of Sudlersville, MD; two sons, Charles Steven Weller of Sudlersville, MD, and Michael Daniel Weller of Easton, MD; one sister, Frances Ruff of Sudlersville, MD; and four

grandchildren, Kyle Weller, Cody Weller, Tom Weller, and Tess Weller.

A visitation will be held on Saturday, December 15, 2012, from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at Calvary Asbury United Methodist Church in Sudlersville, MD, where a service will follow at 12:30 p.m.

“ My Aunt Norma and Uncle Charlie took me in when I was 5. They didn't have to but they did. What a blessing that came to be in my life; though my conscience and spirit knew it deep inside, the hurt, scared adolescent teenager I quickly grew into had a difficult time understanding where I belonged. I was taken care of, raised in faith with hard work, honesty and fun that has never left me and I know they were as patient with me for as long as they were BECAUSE they loved me. In my attempt to find MY OWN place in the world, because that is what it felt like inside the saddest part of this imaginative, little girl whose favorites things included smiling and reading, I alienated them. It wasn't until YEARS later that I realized God must honestly have very special work for me to do. Statistics say the moves in and out of their home, my grandfathers home, and my soon-to-become in-laws 5 times between my 9th grade summer and first quarter of 10th grade weren't going to be resume or scholarship bonuses for the argumentative, rebellious teen. I finally let go to let the spirit my aunt and uncle and grandparents had nurtured for years despite the agitating teen they came to know that gave them little reason to hope the intervention would actually remove me from the abusive, neglectful cycle I had started in. Uncle Charlie isn't my father; nor is Aunt Norma my mother if you are talking DNA. Pop and Grandmom Jean couldn't give me that peace of mind either. It didn't matter what I called them, they really weren't mine. But what they did was not give up on a young lady who DID learn good, right from wrong, compassion, honesty, the importance of an education and working hard as well as how good it feels inside to see the efforts of your labor, to help others and to love selflessly. Uncle Charlie taught me the value of taking care of things, how to laugh and tease (and especially how to take a joke---and those lessons stunk at the time let me tell you). He taught me that quiet was NECESSARY as well as Sanford & Son and the evening news. He taught me that games like baseball, horseshoes and croquet were some necessary fun, ALMOST as necessary as knowing the CORRECT way to play Rummy 500. Cheating earned me a stern, almost angry lecture along with immediate GAME OVER. Since I considered that one of my good times, I learned that cheating

wasn't worth missing the fun with my friend Uncle Charlie. I can't tell you he hugged me as many times as I would have liked and he wasn't the greatest at those three little words everyone craves; some of his teasing even stuck like dry towel to a nasty wound for a long long time. However, I am proud to say their commitment paid off long before his death when I focused the energy of my rearing to reach BIG goals. That's when I know he realized that I hadn't been a waste of his time; he did indeed teach me many things. It finally doesn't matter anymore that my "little girl" didn't know that the Wellers (and Wintersteins) homes were always her "real homes" and where she belonged and was meant to be. I figured out that what really matters is I WAS listening and learning, just to hurt and cautious of more hurt to let them know. The confidence and stability they provided me has given me rewards beyond any quantifiable measure. I have had some awards that were measurable and rather large monetary blessings but they pale in comparison to the ability to see what a good relationship looks like, how to be a mother AND father, routine with consistency, education, love, decency, respect for myself and others, and strong commitment to serving family, neighbors AND strangers. They taught me by example and consequence the most important qualities and lessons of life. It was a blessing to grow up in Charlie Weller's home and I am glad I learned that lesson BEFORE I left this earth. We know that it feels good to be the receiver of gifts and the Lord knows I did receive and it did feel nice but it can't hold a candle to the feelings in your heart when YOU can be the GIVER!
