



Charles "Bud" Langenfelder, Sr.

March 13, 1927 - August 4, 2008

Charles A. "Bud" Langenfelder of Worton, Maryland died on August 4, 2008 at Washington Hospital Center in Washington D.C. He was 81.

He was born on March 13, 1927 in Baltimore County, the son of the late, August and Frieda Kohls Langenfelder. He attended schools in Baltimore County and worked on his family's farm until 1951. On December 10, 1950 he married the former, Katherine Doris Winter and they lived in Baltimore County until 1963 when they moved to Howard County. Mr. Langenfelder worked for 34 years with the United States Department of Agriculture and retired in 1985 as their Animal Disease Control Director. He and his wife moved to Kent County Maryland in 1996. Mr. Langenfelder helped his cousin, Dutch Langenfelder, on his farms and his son, Chuck with his electrical business.

Mr. Langenfelder represented the Maryland State Pork Producers for 21 years, he was known for his BBQ, Hams, and Sausage. A large supporter of 4-H, he was active with the Kent County Fair and the Maryland State Fair. He enjoyed hunting and the outdoors.

He was a 50+ year member of Highland Lodge #184 A.F. & A.M. in Baltimore, MD, a 32 degree member of the Scottish Rite, and a of 50+ year member of Boumi Shrine Temple. He was also instrumental in beginning the Mid Shore Chapter of the Wild Turkey Federation, and a member of Ducks Unlimited and Trinity Lutheran Church in Chestertown.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a son, Charles A. Jr. "Chuck" and his wife, Deborah Langenfelder of Worton, MD; a brother, Kenneth and his wife, Barbara Langenfelder of Abingdon, MD; a sister, Emma Crouse of Baltimore County, MD. He was predeceased by two brothers, John and August Langenfelder and a sister, Lorraine Bollinger.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday, August 7, 2008 at 11:00 A.M. at Fellows, Helfenbein, and Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., 130 Speer Road, Chestertown, MD where relatives and friends may call one hour prior to the service on Thursday and on Wednesday, August 6, 2008 between the hours of 1:00 -4:00 PM and from 6:00-8:00 PM. A Masonic Service will be held at 8pm.

Interment will be in Union Cemetery in Worton, MD.
